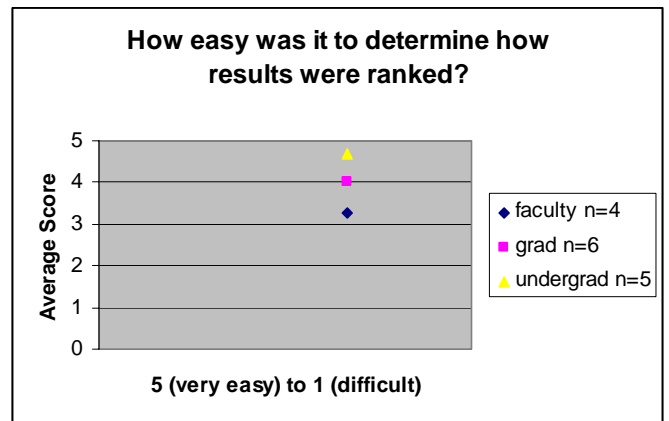
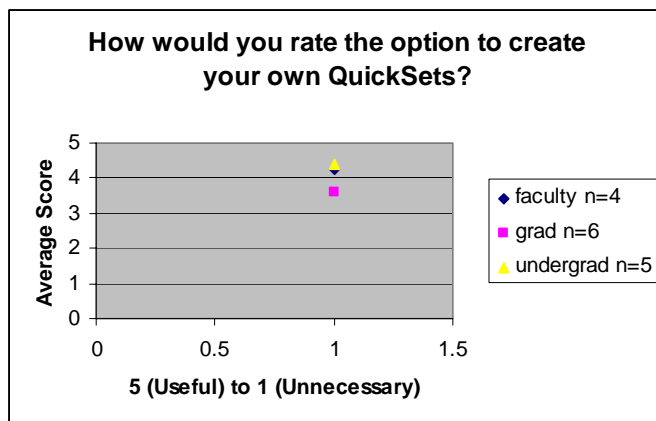
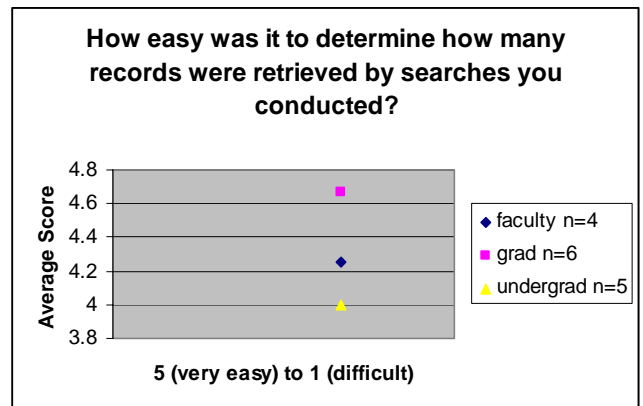
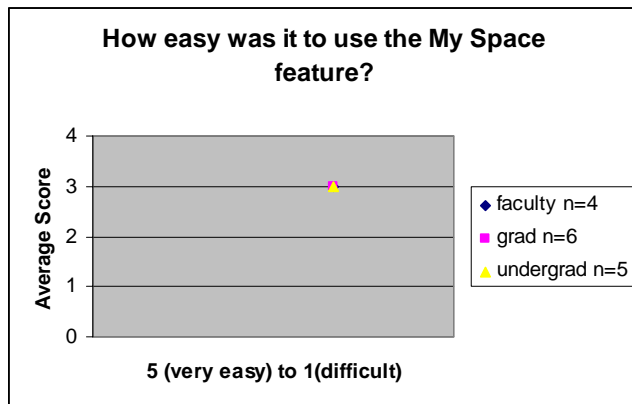
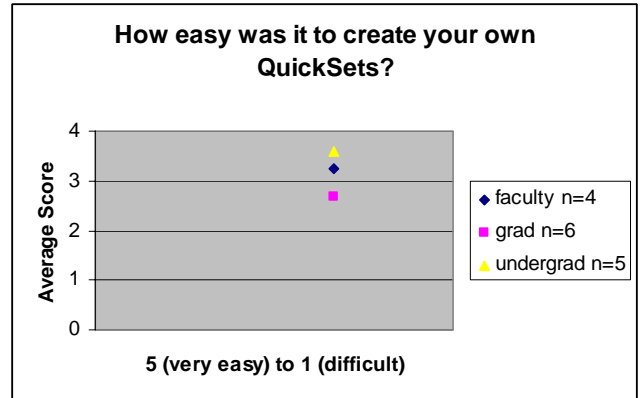
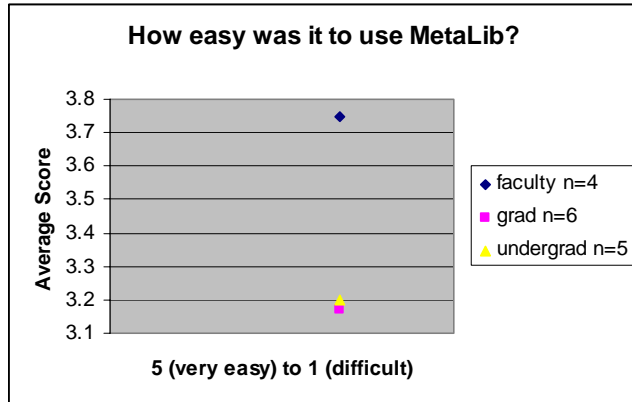
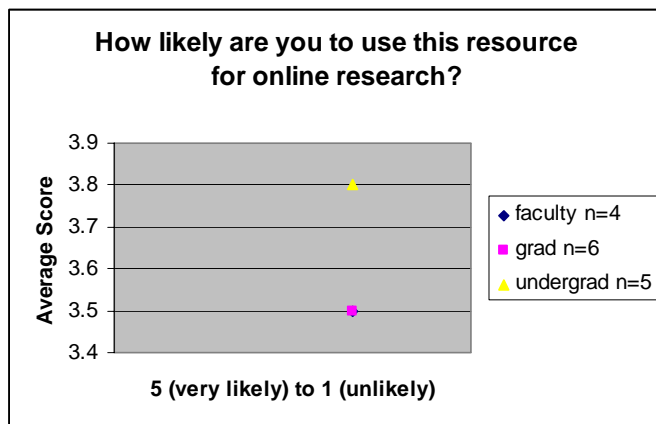
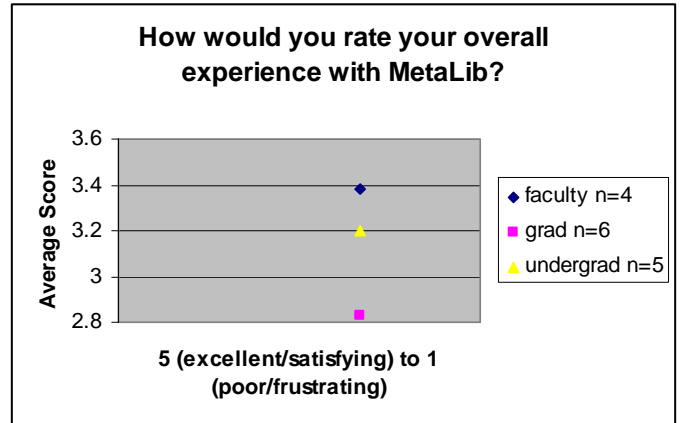
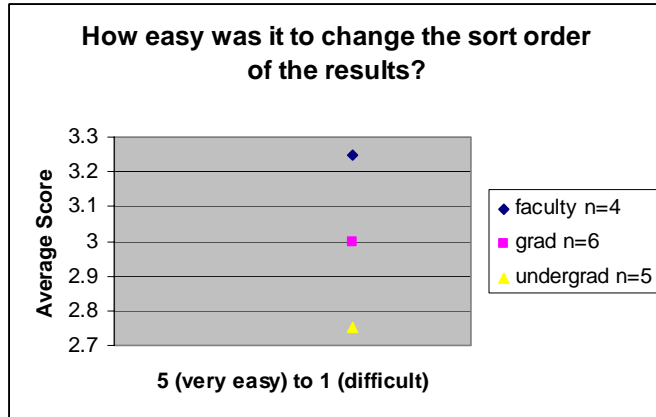


Addendum to the Usability Test Report for MetaLib: Comparison of Participant User Groups

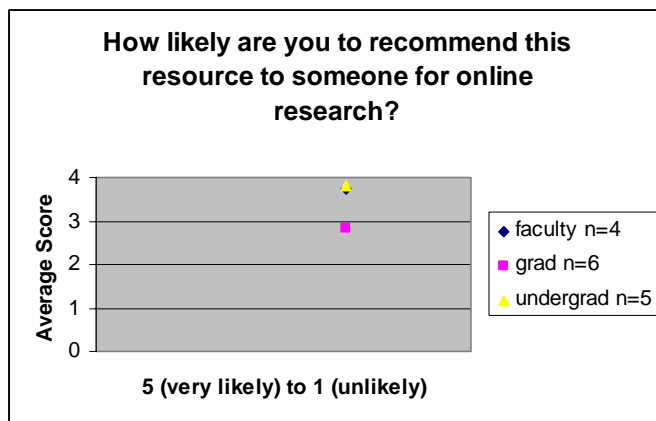
